# BRAVEHEART SEXUAL RISK AVOIDANCE CURRICULUM

Description: Using humor, true stories, and facts about the risks of sexual activity, this program focuses centrally on having healthy relationships, sexual risk avoidance (abstinence), and the consequences of premarital sex. Though entertaining, this program is full of accurate information about teenage pregnancy, sexually transmitted diseases, and the emotional risks of premarital sexual activity. In line with Centers for Disease Control (CDC) and State of Georgia Performance Standards, the objective of this program is to encourage students to postpone sexual activity until a committed marriage relationship.

### **COMPONENT 7.3: SEX AND FIRE**

- Sex is the same way: in the right place (committed marriage relationship) it is safe and enjoyable, outside
  of that safe location it is dangerous can hurt you and can even kill you.
